Dear Friends of the CIC,

Easter greetings! Easter Sunday may be behind us, but the culmination of the season still lies ahead this month. Our Easter joy becomes jubilant at Pentecost, celebrating the coming of the Holy Spirit and the disciples widely sharing the news that Jesus Christ is alive!

One of my favorite Easter hymns is, “In the Breaking of Bread” by Michael Ward. Each verse weaves the story of how the disciples

encountered the Risen Lord, starting with the two on the road to Emmaus, then with the disciples in the upper room, then the coming of the Spirit – ever widening the circle of those who encounter the Lord to today.

The third verse describes the work of the Holy Spirit: “Then the Spirit of the Lord came down upon us, *filling us, changing us, giving us the strength* to say: We saw him! Suddenly our eyes were opened, and we know he is alive!”

Receiving the Holy Spirit, we are drawn more deeply into the heart of the Risen Christ, growing in his love. The Holy Spirit enlivens and guides us in this life in Christ, through changes and leading us along new pathways, so that we can share the saving love of God with the world.

Inspired by the Holy Spirit, the Catholic Information Center has served Catholics and spiritual seekers in Western Michigan for 75 years. Newcomers have been welcomed into the Church, individuals have strengthened their Catholic identity, and healing and reconciliation has been brought to those once alienated from the Catholic Church.

Following the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the ministry of the Center continues to evolve as we strive to meet the growing and changing needs in our area. As we finalize our process of prayer and renewal started last year, one of the clearly emerging ministries of the Center is leadership formation. Three tracks already exist – for Spanish speakers, for young adults, and for Bible study facilitators. This fall, we plan to build on these by developing new tracks that will inspire and empower lay Catholics to greater service in their parishes and their civic communities. These new programs will be offered with the same welcoming spirit of the Paulist Fathers that has helped so many to know, love, and celebrate their faith in the Risen Lord.

Thank you for your continued partnership in the mission of the Center through your prayerful and financial support. May the Holy Spirit who has been poured into our hearts (Rm 5:5) continue to inspire and guide you in your life in Christ.

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of the faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.

And may all of us share the same proclamation of those who have gone before us, “we have seen him, and we know he is alive! Alleluia!”
