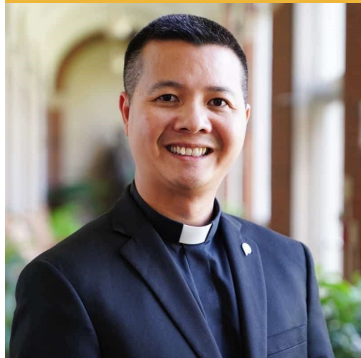

Dear friends of the Center,

I am thrilled to share that we recently received a significant grant from Lilly Endowment Inc. through its *Thriving Congregations Initiative*. This generous five-year, \$1.25 million grant will support our new initiative, *Formed as Disciples, Prepared for Mission*.

This initiative builds on the success of our current Leadership Formation Institute. As we navigate rapid social and cultural changes, the Institute aims to

strengthen and equip lay Catholics to live out their faith and values at work, with family and friends, and in the wider community.

The grant will allow us to expand current programming, focusing particularly on underrepresented groups within their parishes. Lay people eager to use their spiritual and personal gifts in service of their fellow parishioners and community neighbors will be invited to participate in the Leadership Formation Institute.

We aim to reach nearly 300 lay people, deepening their relationship with God, fostering connections with people from other parishes, and contributing to the flourishing of their communities and the wider world. Participants will gain clarity about our values and mission as the Church, drawing upon practices rooted in Catholic tradition.

To support participants, we are creating a consultation process for pastors and their staff to identify ways to enhance ministry in their parishes. This will help participants discern where best to direct their gifts and learning by creating parish projects that address needs in their community. The funding from Lilly allows us to offer mini-grants to support these parish projects, further enhancing our collective efforts.

Lilly Endowment's *Thriving Congregations Initiative* is designed to help organizations like ours better understand the changing landscape in which we serve. As a Paulist ministry, the Catholic Information Center remains a center for evangelization. This new initiative is a means of addressing the evolving social contexts and identifying the spiritual hungers of people in West Michigan, so that they may respond readily to our invitation to know Christ and his Gospel.

We are grateful for the support of Lilly Endowment Inc., and we remain deeply grateful for your continued partnership. Thank you for your unwavering support and commitment to our mission. Together we are building a bright future for our Church!

I could not forget the current priests at the Cathedral who spread the Good News every day with so many people, parishioners or not. This is who the Paulists are! I will always be grateful for the Paulist Fathers.
